<p>Course Content:</p> <p>During their time at BCPRU, students will be given the opportunity to experience a variety of different mediums including, mod-rock, plaster, clay (drying and baked), light boxes, pens, paint, pencils, charcoal, chalk, pastels and collage.</p> <p>Students follow a scheme of work that is structured to enable them to achieve and be successful. Part of this scheme is to see Art as a process; they will plan a piece of work and see it through to completion.</p> <p>We give opportunities for students to develop skills including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drawing • Shading • Colour mixing • 3D modelling • Using materials creatively <p>Due to the small numbers in class groups, we try to accommodate student's preferences and will encourage students to engage with seasonal themes and celebrations.</p> <p>Another aspect of the Art curriculum is to consider the cultural and historical context that art is produced in; we look at local, national and global art. This makes art a useful subject for enforcing cross curricular learning.</p> <p>Art is seen as a useful tool to developing emotional literacy, self-esteem, confidence and anger management. We allow students the time and space to have positive staff-pupil relationships.</p> <p>Art is offered as part of the after school curriculum, it is very popular and is another way for students to work independently and develop positive social interactions.</p> <p>As part of the enrichment included within the art curriculum, we use educational visits to galleries and museums to enhance students learning.</p>
